Membership of The Pony Club offers fun, friendship, training, events and competitions. Twin Trees joined the scheme in Autumn 2000 and has a large number of active members. The scheme we run here is for non-horse owning riders who ride with us on a regular basis to enable them to participate in Centre Pony Club Activities. Maximum age is 25

2 types of membership: Centre and Branch membership

Centre members ride at a Pony Club Linked Riding Centre and not have their own pony. Their subscription lasts for 12 months from the day of joining.

Branch members need to have or have use of a pony. A member can only belong to one branch at a time. There is a joining fee and annual subscription. Annual subscriptions are due on 1 November for the following year.
